



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

Women's Domestic Violence Helpline	Support Service	The Women's Domestic Violence Helpline is a state wide 24 hour service. This service provides support for women, with or without children, who are experiencing family and domestic violence. This includes information and advice, referral to local advocacy and support services, liaison with police if necessary, assessment of the child's experience if there are children in the family and support in escaping situations of family and domestic violence. Men's Domestic Violence Helpline	Support Service	The Men's Domestic Violence Helpline is a state wide 24 hour service. This service provides telephone information and referral to ongoing face to face services for men who are concerned about their violent and abusive behaviours. This service will also assess the child's experience if there are children in the family and provide information about accessing legal advice, accommodation and other support services for people who have been served with a violence restraining order. A telephone based interpreting service is available. The Men's Domestic Violence Helpline also provides information and support for men who have experienced family and domestic violence.
